Thomasina— Friday, September 8

Thomasina, currently serving as Connecticut State Troubadour, is an internationally recognized mountain dulcimer player, singer and song writer whose performances weave together the best of traditional and contemporary folk music. She touches audiences with her simplicity, humanity and strength drawn from the deep roots of the folk tradition. Her unique and complex adaptations on the dulcimer have earned her acclaim and air play on over twenty stations across the globe.



Rod MacDonald— Friday, September 22

Described as the quintessential singer/songwriter, Rod MacDonald is one of the most politically and socially aware lyricists of our time. His signature songs, “American Jerusalem” and “Sailor’s Hymn” as well as his other enduring classics are covered by more than two dozen recording artists. His three-decade performing career and eight albums have gained him fans and recognition all over the world. His songs provide an audience with “something to touch your heart....to awaken your spirit....and to tickle your funny bone.”

Rod Mark Sustic & Tom MacKenzie— Friday, October 6

This lively duo of musicians have been and continue to be part of a number of renowned bands in the Northeast, such as the Woods Tea Company, the High Road, the Will Dicker Boys, Yankee Chank and Northern Routes. Mark plays string bass, fiddle, banjo and guitar; Tom is regarded by many as the finest hammered dulcimer player in the business with several recordings of his own. Both musicians add sparkling vocals to their performances, in which bluegrass licks and Irish tunes abound.



Mad Agnes— Friday, October 20

Exquisite harmonies are the trademark of the trio called Mad Agnes—composed of Adrienne Jones, Margo Hennebach and Mark Saunders, a new, thoroughly entertaining trio of superb vocalists and multiple-instrumentalists. All three artists have impressive separate performance and songwriting histories, and together they present a stunning, fast-paced show. Reviewer Peter Spink says of their music “A fusion of folk, pop and classical contrapuntal harmonies—contemporary and yet...timeless— “sort of Paul Simon meets Bach, as sung by the Bitching Babes.”
